Real will also provide musical direction for the performance, which takes place Saturday, Sept. 24, at 7 p.m. in the Rosslyn Spectrum Theater in Arlington, Va.

About NICOLAS REAL

Flautist, director, composer and teacher, Real has a solid trajectory in classic and popular music. He came up through Venezuela's National System of Youth and Children's Orchestras — known popularly as El Sistema — to become a member of the Simón Bolívar Symphony Orchestra and several chamber music groups, including Venezuela's Miquirebo Flute Quartet, the Venezuelan National Flute Orquestra and the Real-Peña duet.

In 1991, he received a degree in music from the University Institute of Musical Studies (IUDEM) in Venezuela. In 2003, he received a master's degree in music from Central Michigan University, followed by, in 2013, a doctorate in musical arts from Temple University in Philadelphia.

Real's compositions for flute and chamber instruments have been performed by distinguished ensembles, among them the Massachussetts Flute Choir, The Crescent Duo, Venezuela's National Orchestra of Flutes, and the Miquirebo Flute Quartet. And he has served as an invited director for symphony orchestras and chamber music groups in the Bahamas, Colombia, South Korea, the United States and Venezuela, demonstrating his dominance of both classical and popular repertoires. In 2004, he released his first solo CD, "Nicolás Real-Música Oriental Venezolana," in which he explored eastern Venezuela's rich musical traditions. A U.S. tour "Nicolás Real, Sounds of Latin America," was produced by Amundos Productions and supported by CITGO Corp.

In the summer of 2015, he was a flautist in the Simón Bolívar Symphony Orchestra, a professor at the Latin American Flute Academy, a flute professor at the University of the Andes, and a visiting instructor for the National System of Youth and Children's Orchestras. He is a successful soloist and international teacher.

Teatro de la Luna, founded in 1991, advances Latin American culture through theater and other performing arts. Its director, Mario Marcel, is a recipient of the *Elizabeth Campbell Award* of the American Association of University Women (Arlington, Va., chapter) for his work in the arts. He also is a two-time winner of the *STAR* award from the Arlington County Arts Commission for his administrative excellence and service to the community. La Luna's producer, Nucky Walder, was honored with the *Latina Woman Leadership* prize in 2009.

La Luna's mission is to use Spanish-language and bilingual cultural productions as a bridge to connect the Hispanic and the English-speaking communities.
